**Subject:** Licensing for Out of State Providers and Emergency Licenses Issued During the Covid-19 Public Health Emergency

If you are a NH Medicaid enrolled provider located outside of New Hampshire that provide services to patients in NH via telehealth you may need a New Hampshire license. Refer to New Hampshire [RSA 310:7](#) for more information.

During the COVID-19 State of Emergency, the New Hampshire Office of Professional Licensure and Certification issued emergency licenses to certain New Hampshire Medicaid Enrolled Providers located out of state to allow for continuity of care through the emergency. Emergency licenses issued during the New Hampshire COVID-19 State of Emergency were converted to a permanent license pursuant to Senate Bill 277 (2022). These licenses will expire on June 3, 2024. If you are practicing in New Hampshire or providing services to individuals in New Hampshire via telehealth, you may need to renew your license before it expires.
